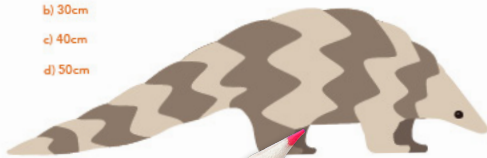

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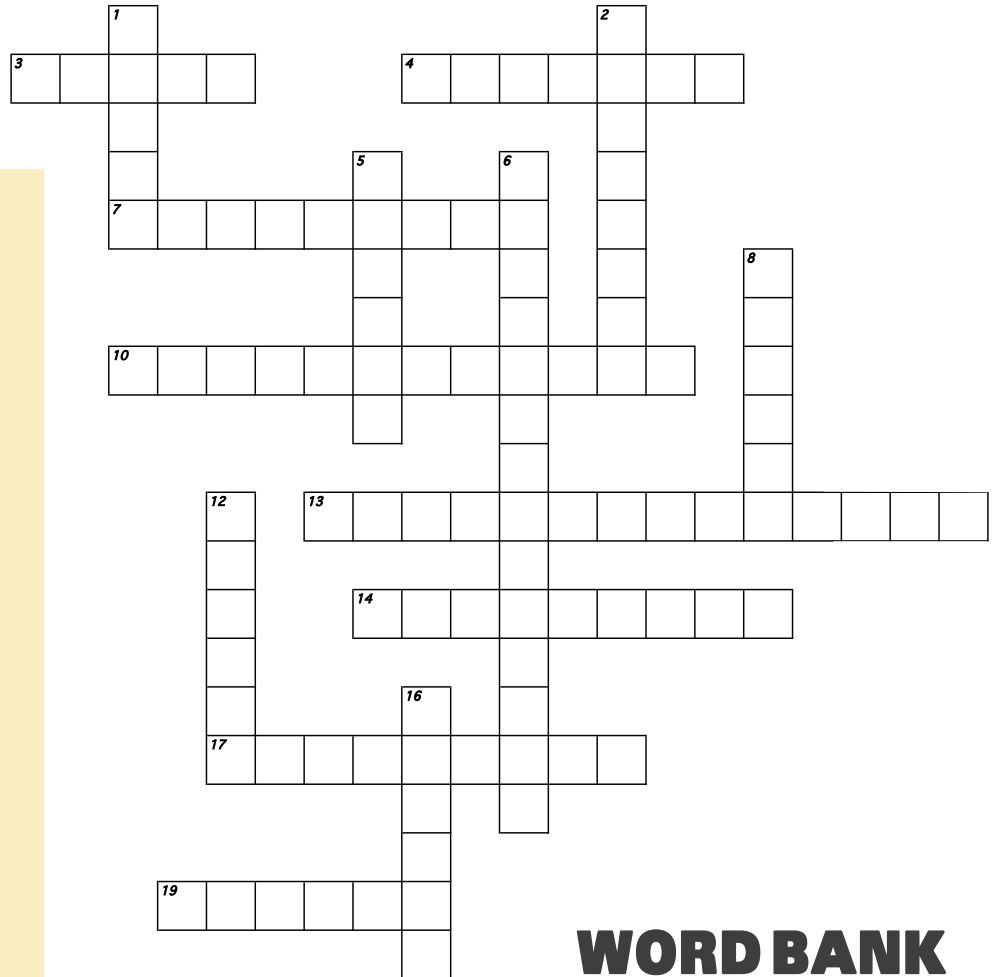

- 16 A small striped termite-eating marsupial.

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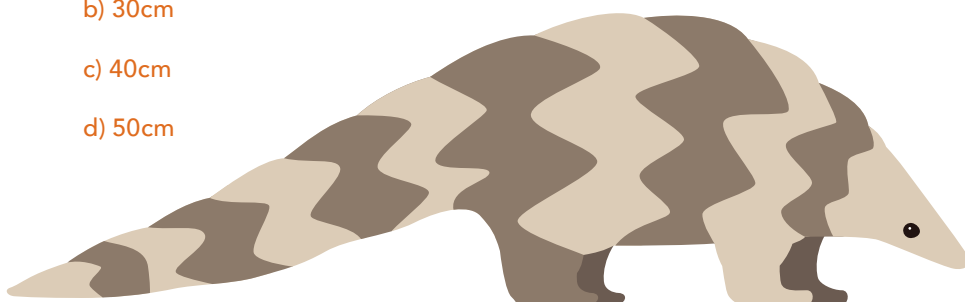
